
Please Pray for Our Seminarians

The Diocese is blessed to have eight men studying for the priesthood. **Samuel Ivkovich, John Paul Gan** and **Christopher McGurn** are in theology (major seminary) and are a year or two away from being ordained deacons. **Riley Morris, Aaron Pabin, Maximilian Kolbe Gan** and **William Gugala** are in college (minor seminary) working on their bachelor degrees. Our man **Caleb Baker** is finishing up his pastoral year in Cambridge and should be back in the minor seminary this fall. The seminary can be a rough ride and they need your prayers.

Notes from the Pastor

What I've been Reading: Bishop Erik Varden was born into a non-practicing Lutheran family. At 19 he became a Catholic. He entered a Trappist monastery in England at 28, was ordained a priest at 37 and was made abbot of the monastery at 39. At 45 he was made the bishop of Trodheim in Sweden. He is the author of numerous books on the faith and recently gave a retreat in Rome to Pope Leo and many of the cardinals. His book *Healing Wounds* considers the wounds that Christ suffered during his Passion and Crucifixion and how focusing on them can provide healing for our troubled souls. It is very well written, but a little academic.

How About that New Pope?: It's been just over a year, but I think that Pope Leo has been doing a great job. He's not that flashy and is doing a lot of good things behind the scenes. He is focused on unity and trying to take the best of what has come before him, "like the owner of a house who brings out of his storeroom new treasures as well as old." [Matthew 13:52] He has made a number of appointments in important positions with people who are loyal to the Magisterium, hard workers and don't seek out the limelight. More good things are coming. Please keep him, and all of our bishops, in your prayers.



St. Bernard Parish Council – May 18th

St. James is now paying towards Fr. Tim's expenses: Back in December 2025 St. James was allowed to not pay towards Fr. Tim's expenses until they paid off the roof. They were recently able to pay off the roof. There was discussion that it is reasonable for them to start paying towards Fr. Tim's expenses. When Fr. Tim first took over both parishes he approached both Parish Councils and proposed that St. James pay one-third of his expenses and St. Bernard pay the rest. St. James' share was \$1,300 per month. Back in November 2024 this amount was reduced to \$1,000 per month. After some discussion it was voted that they pay \$650 towards Fr. Tim's expenses. They will start paying at the end of April.

Problems with Tim Staples Parish Mission: The Mission with Tim Staples was a disappointment. It was noted that 120 people showed up the first night and only 70 people the second. Tim Staples talked for two hours the first night although he was told beforehand to only speak for one hour and then to field questions. Fr. Tim spoke with a number of people during and after the Mission. People said that the first night he seemed to ramble, he spent way too much time on certain points and barely touched on others and he seemed to be talking over people's heads. He was much better the second night but he exhibited the same issues. At least two dozen people left while he was still talking. Fr. Tim mentioned that in the future he would make sure that the speaker knew what was expected of them. He would also let them know that if the problem gets out of hand that he will interrupt the speaker.

2027 Parish Mission: The 2027 Parish Mission is with Maggie Craig. Yvonne Huck has been in contact with her. Although no contract has been signed and no down payment made, in the email Maggie has agreed to a three day Mission starting Sunday, February 28th, 2027. The cost is \$3,000 plus travel expenses. She wants to be paid for speaking at the schools. There was discussion about the theme of the 2027 Parish Mission and what specific talks we want. It was mentioned that Maggie's website is maggie-craig.com and that there is a list of some of her popular talks.

2028 Parish Mission: The 2028 Mission is with Joe McLane. We have already made a \$500 down payment.

Light in church choir loft: One of the hanging fluorescent lights was not working. We tried changing the bulbs but this did not fix the problem. RW Miller was called in. They replaced the fluorescent bulbs with LEDs. This item is finished.

Icemaker in Parish Hall is kind of working: The icemaker in the kitchen is typically turned off. It only takes a couple of hours for it to start making ice. If it is turned on the day before an event there will be a full bin of ice. It is then turned off after the event. This seems to be working well for now.

Water in one of the CCD rooms: Several times we have noticed some water on the floor of one of the CCD rooms after a rain. We think that we have tracked it down to a problem with the caulking on the ramp. It is about five years old and seems to have degraded. This is to be expected. We have been in contact with Dana Wilson who did it the last time.

Problem with toilet in Hall: One of the toilets in the women's restroom on the main floor of the Hall was wobbling. RW Miller came in and fixed it. This item is complete.

Backflow check: The backflow in the Hall needs to be checked on a regular basis. Brewer Fire came in recently to check the backflow. A meter was replaced. It passed inspection. This item is finished.

Problem with phone and fire system in Hall: The fire system needs to use the phone to call the fire department in case of an alarm. When the system was checked several weeks ago by Southeastern Security the phone was not working. Frontier was contacted and was able to quickly fix the problem. This item is finished.

Slow internet in Hall: We have had a problem with slow internet in the Hall for a while. This internet is also used in the church, which is why we have had trouble streaming the Sunday Mass. The issue was that it was using a copper line. We have been working with Frontier to upgrade to fiber for almost two months. It has finally been upgraded. This item is finished.

Replacing Tom Minton on Parish Council: There was discussion about replacing Tom Minton, who was the Parish Council VP and also dealt with Hall rentals. Lucy Duff agreed to be VP and Neal Offenberger agreed to handle the Hall rentals. Several names were recommended and discussed as new Parish Council members to replace Tom and to be considered as future Council members.
